- Into a vibrant town
- Once past the CV19 threat we must focus on restoring the Visitor Market. Both the Air Visitor component and the Cruise component need focus. The Cruise component should NOT be about the large ships at Dockyard and certainly not about bringing large ships to St. George. We need to procure medium sized ships (100-200 pax) on 1 week itineraries from Boston and New York to be alongside for 4+ days. Two such ships would bootstrap the Towne's business sector more effectively that any other single development hotel, marina, or even casino.
- Introduce more business. Build an office building and condos.
- To keep its charm and encourage more of a sailors paradise
- Better offerings at shops. Identity.
- The city needs to be modernize and use its building. Enough of closed building. The owners need to use them, rent them or sell them

- Look forward to more goods and services. More local artists, antique dealers, vegan restaurants and grocers, local crafts, food vendors, pedestrian only with exception for seniors and handicapped. Play fountain in square or right off square for children. Open air wellness events/classes. Hosting flea/resale, vendors markets in large car parks on Sundays.

- There are few opportunities for fitness in St George's, e.g. there are no nice gyms, or yoga studios for the local community. Something in this area could be developed. In addition, more 'upscale' evening events such as weekly happy hours would attract people to come out e.g. currently no restaurants on the waterfront offer such a thing. Tempest restaurant does not even open its patio doors, so that space is left unused. Public spaces can also be utilized more for events, e.g. the town square/ordnance island for drive in movie nights or small local concerts.
- Alfresco dining options along King Square & Water Street, electric transport options, cannabis zone, marina, new re-enactments, business development office with Quango, SEEZ concessions, penalties for derelict buildings, grants to open new businesses in town, Fort St Catherine leased, more beaches with amenities, ferry year round, ferries nights and weekends to Hamilton and Dockyard during summer, live art at King Square weekly, Somers Garden leased
